Home zone

All students who live within the home zone described below* (and shown on the attached map) shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Starting at the intersection of Vipond Road and Whangaparaoa Road cross north east to the coastline (Glenelg Road excluded). Travel south and east along the coast line to the eastern boundary of Stanmore Bay Park. Travel south along the park boundary to the intersection of Brightside Road (159, 162 and below included) and Glanville Close (excluded). Continue south along the eastern boundary of Rata Reserve, along Rimu Road, south west along Rata Road, south east along Matai Road, south along Whangaparaoa Road (308 - 648, 275 - 651 included), and west along Karepiro Drive. From the intersection of Kareripo Drive and Rishworth Avenue (excluded), travel across country and south to 107 Wade River Road (107, 106 and above included). Continue cross country to the intersection of Wade River Road and Ferry Road (excluded) and west to the coastline. Travel north along the coastline to the intersection of Poplar Road, Melia Place (both included), and Whangaparaoa Road. Travel north east along both sides of Whangaparaoa Road, back to the starting point.

All no exit streets off included boundary roads are included.

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment for the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a specific date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulated in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Out of zone enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulated in the area served by the school.

The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

- First priority: This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary.
- Second priority: must be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
- Third priority: must be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- Fourth priority: must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- Fifth priority: must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- Sixth priority: must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary for Education under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
